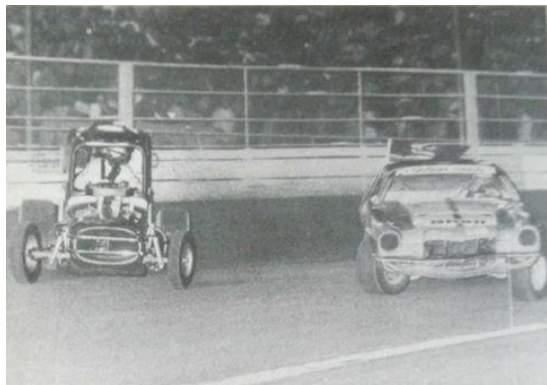
Sunday June 23 – Starting from 10am, Finish at 2pm. *(Lunch and Refreshments Provided)*

DIFFERENT CLASSES RACING TOGETHER



One question that is often asked is can different speedway classes run together on the track at the same time?

We can confirm that this is in fact permitted, with examples going back as far as the Early 1970's as you can see pictured. Such practices have no effect on the competitor's personal accident insurance - provided that the classes have similar safety standards.

If the safety standards are similar, then the decision to allow divisions to run together depends on approval being forthcoming from the host track, and the

respective divisional governing body (For example, such practice is not permitted with Speedway Sedans Australia Classes).
